Where To Go... By John Esau as told to Ken Penner and How to Get There

I often visit in old age homes as part of the ministry I have with people in the Lower Mainland-Greater Vancouver Area of British Columbia. This particular day I was visiting the elderly at an Old Age home in Abbotsford B.C.. I asked the women in charge if there was anyone in particular who might need a visit. They said there were two men who were atheists, but they would only tell me "Where to go and how to get there." I was used to having some very different responses from people that I ministered to, so this did not bother me in the least. I said I would like to see them.

One of the fellows was Herbie, who was 92 years old when I met him. He had led a rough life and as a result was separated from the rest of his family. He was really a lonely man. I befriended him and got to know him over the next year and a half. During this time I tried to show him the love of God through both word and deed. We became good friends. As I shared the hope we have through the good news of Jesus Christ, he informed me his mother had told him the same things that I was telling him. She too had

been a Christian but he didn't believe there was a God. He had been through the war and seen and done some terrible things, possibly this had caused him to question the reality of God. He had run away from home when he was 16 years old and believed he had been too great of a sinner for God, if there was one, to be able to forgive him. I shared with him the Scripture from 1 John 1:9 which says "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and will purify us from all unrighteousness." NIV

One day he told me that he wanted to apologize to me. I asked him what he wanted to apologize to me about. He said he was sorry for treating me so meanly when I had spoken to him about God. I indicated to him that I would forgive him, but I had not noticed that he had done this to me. I asked him what made him suddenly think of this. He said that he now believed in God, he believed in Jesus and he believed what Jesus had done for him. I

told him that there was still something missing, that he should thank the Lord for the faith he had given him. He said "Don't push me." There was a marked change in his outlook after this, he began to pray that he would find some members of his family and he also prayed for my wife and for me. Herbie was a shining light and a great witness for Jesus Christ after his conversion.

At one point his foot became infected and the Doctor told him that it needed to be amputated. He was quite upset when he told me about this. I anointed him with oil according to the Bible as recorded in James 5:14, 15 and prayed a prayer similar to this; "Lord, Herbie is a new Christian, he is only learning to walk and grow as a Christian. He needs his foot to be able to walk both spiritually as well as physically, so please Lord spare his foot and let him walk for you. Amen."

His operation was scheduled in the next couple days and he went for his surgery. The hospital phoned the

staff at the Old age home and told them that Herbie's operation was successful. I assumed that the doctors had removed his foot. As I went to visit him in his room, I asked him how he was doing, he said he was well. I looked and saw both of his feet sticking out of the blanket, they had not removed his foot but had operated on a vein in his foot instead. God had answered our prayer.

Two of Herbie's daughters showed up one day, they had been looking for him and found him through the Department of Veterans Affairs. The atmosphere was tense at first because the girls felt that he had abandoned them. As the conversation progressed, one of the daughters asked if he was a Christian. He indicated that he was, and she replied that she too was a Christian. Herbie apologized for not caring for them as he should have and for leaving them alone all those years. They had great fellowship together after that.

As I entered Herbie's room one day, the workers told me that I should talk to him about death, as they thought he was dying. He was lying on his bed with his face to the wall. As I called out his name, he turned towards me and it was

obvious he was quite depressed, as he told me he had no reason to live anymore. He said he was of no earthly good anymore and just wanted to die. I asked him if he still prayed for me and he said he did, every day. I told him I still needed his prayers and would pray that he would feel better. After I prayed for him, his face brightened and he again had purpose to live.

Some time later, when I visited him, he said he felt it was soon his time to go to be with the Lord. As I left, he told me if he didn't see me again here on earth, he would see me in heaven.

The next time I went to visit him, the workers told me that I had just missed him, he had died just before I had arrived that morning.

The Bible tells us in Psalm 116:15 "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints." NIV What a privilege it was to know Herbie, no longer an atheist but a saint. I know he is now enjoying eternal life in heaven with our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and I will join him there one day.

IF / ...THEN WHAT?

Society today tells you that there are many reasons why it cannot love you just the way you are. It tells you that if you don't look more beautiful, if you don't wear the popular clothes, if you are not more cool, then people will not accept you. This is what it takes to be accepted by the standards of our society.

As I studied English in high school, I learned about something called an if / then clause. It is a rule that if you use the word 'if' in a sentence, you must also use the word 'then' soon after it. It is there to indicate a cause/ effect relationship.

In Herbie's story, we read of a couple 'if/then' clauses in his life. If you believed that you had sinned too much for God to ever be able to forgive you, then you would feel hopeless about life. This is how Herbie felt. If you had "led a rough life" and had become separated from your family and friends, then you would become lonely. Just as Herbie was.

Often, society is cruel in its consequences for our actions. Perhaps you too have been through circumstances that have dealt you nothing but hopelessness, loneliness, and pain.

However, God offers us a chance to experience his blessing and loving kindness if we will only come to Him. In 1st John 1:7-9, the author tells us about three if / then clauses that lead to life! He says:

1. If we claim to be without sin, [then] we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.
2. If we confess our sins [then] He is faithful and just to forgive us our sin and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
3. If we walk in the light, [then] the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

What peace and joy came into Herbie's life when he submitted to God's truth and came to Jesus for cleansing and a new life. This hope is available to all, if they only come to God through the way he has opened, his Son Jesus Christ. Please consider this final if / then clause in Scripture. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His one and only Son. [If we] believe in Him, [then] we shall not die, but have ever lasting life." (John 3:16 my paraphrase) If you truly catch the meaning of this, you will find eternal life...Just as Herbie did!
