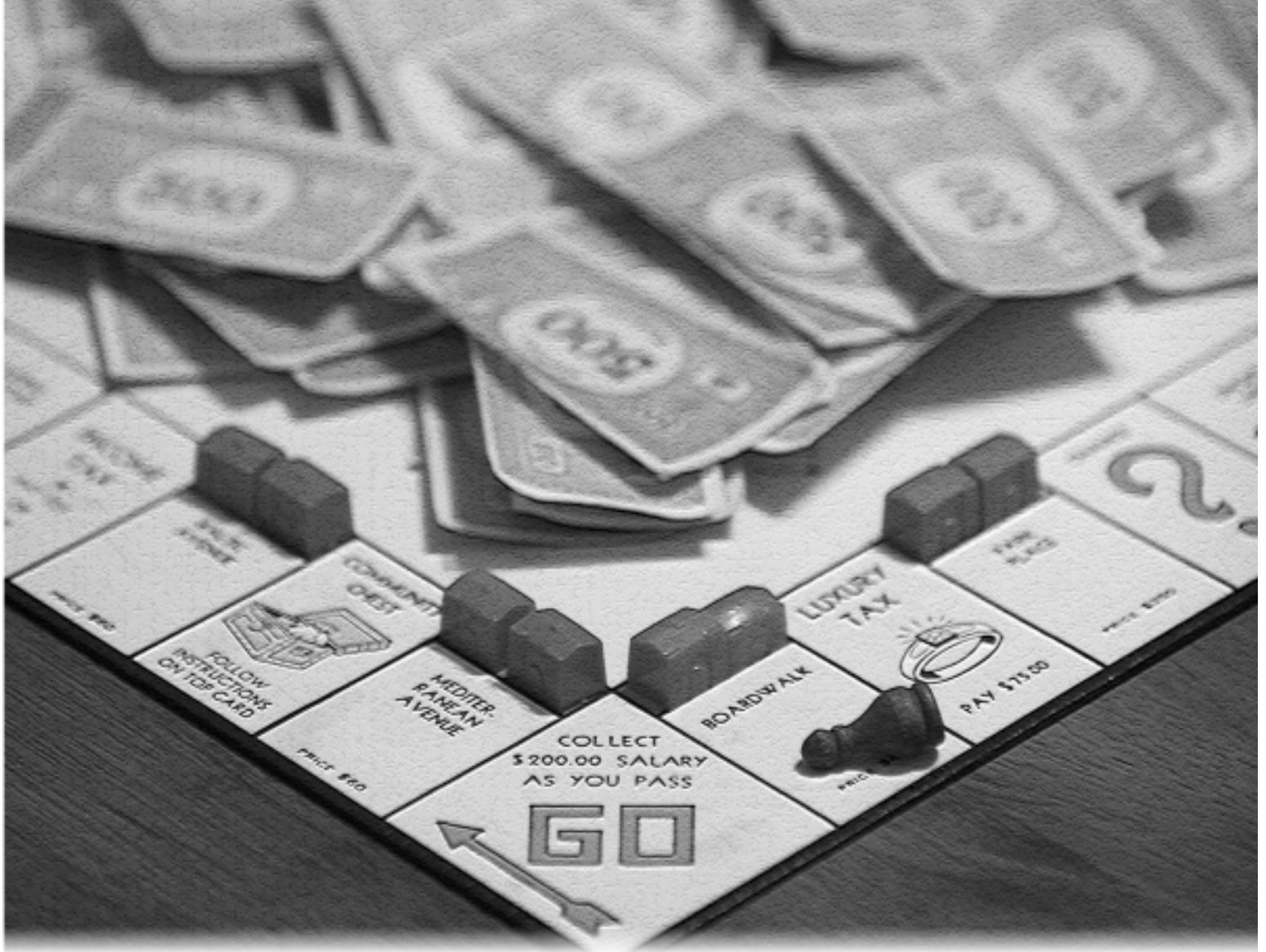

NO WAY OUT

The testimony of Wally Unger

My first memories that I have are sitting in the back seat of our old 1936 Ford with my other three siblings, all under the age of seven with everything we owned in a small two wheeled trailer. We were heading to Bible School in Southern Sask. with our father and mother. My father was this wonderful man of faith. God had called him to Bible School and even though he had four young children (and another on the way) and a wife to support and no money in the bank, he went.

So from an early age my father modeled for me, what living by faith meant. Taking by faith when God said “I shall supply all your needs.”

I grew up in Northern Sask. where we moved after my father graduated. I have no negative memories growing up. We lived in a small town of Weekes until grade seven and then moved to an even smaller town of Beatty, Sask. My work took me to Edmonton and then to Port Alberni. After a few years I decided I would try to find myself and quit my job and headed to Europe for a year and a half. Always looking to see if I could find meaning in life and what God perhaps had planned for my life.

On my return I ended up back in Edmonton where I met my wife and we were married. I bought into a business and this new venture took us to Vancouver nearly 35yrs ago. The business did

well and we lived in a beautiful house in a very nice subdivision. We had a son and a daughter who are the love of my life and did us proud. We went to the same church for 17 years and had many wonderful friends. So there we were: A great job, lots of money, beautiful house, lovely children, a great church, a place in Palm Springs, and many friends. Until the age of 55 my life was quite wonderful.

But just when I thought everything in my life was so secure, all that I knew was about to be turned upside-down.

My inner search to find out what God wanted for my life continued. Without understanding why at the time, God led me to a very dark place. I started to volunteer one night a week at Union Gospel Mission in the Downtown Eastside of Vancouver. This area is the slums of Vancouver. I used to drive through this area of town and I had no empathy for any of these people. I told myself that they were a bunch of lazy bums and had brought their misery on themselves. A scourge on our welfare system etc.

About that same time everything that had been going right in my life, started to go wrong. My financial adviser who I had been dealing with for many years, and trusted completely, started to get greedy and without me paying much attention put my investments into much riskier areas. He got me involved in condo projects that became leaky and would not rent out and I not only lost them but ended up with judgments against me. Everything began to collapse around me. My own family started to be affected, and my marriage fell apart. Everything was going from bad to worse and all hope was seemingly gone. However life still had to go on.

I was still going to Union Gospel Mission, trying to be a mentor to the drug addicts and homeless people. I started the Alpha program at UGM and a six month program called "From Bondage to Freedom". People were coming to Christ. One year we baptized forty four people, and yet I walked around with a mask on, and the mask had a big smile. Inside I was dying. Seemingly there was no way out of the mess that I found myself in. Nearly every day I just wanted to die. This went on week after week, month after month, year after year. In fact it went on for five years. I would sleep for an hour and wake up and worry for an hour. Wanting to run, but no place to run to. I had one friend, Fred Colburn, who walked with me every day for those five years. 1800 days in a row and literally saved my life. A better friend no one could ask for.

Then came that day, Oct. 15th 2001. I sat in the same chair I sat in every morning reading my Bible and praying. I never knew if my prayers were getting past the ceiling as I was in

darkness with no light at the end of the tunnel. That morning I cried out to God that I could not run my life anymore, but if He would take over my life and run it I would do whatever He asked me to do for the rest of my life. I forgave two people that I felt had destroyed my life. It was basically a total and irrevocable surrender of the rest of my life to Jesus Christ. God had to get me to the point where I could no longer rely on my bank account, my friends, my wife, and had to totally rely on Him.

What happened next was a huge miracle. I was flooded with this total peace, joy and love in my heart. The problems were all still there, but now they were not my problems anymore and the fear, despair and hopelessness were gone. "Cast all your cares on Me". Psalms 55:22. That night as I sat in my driveway in Fred's vehicle I told him it was over. He looked at me in disbelief and he could not believe it. After five years of hell in my life it was over just like that? I can honestly say that from

that day to this, I have not had one fear or despair in my life. Fred and I will be getting together on Oct 15th for breakfast, as we do every Oct 15th to celebrate 10 years of freedom from my addiction of making lots of money, keeping up with the Jones and retiring in Palm Springs.

God is now running my life. The main thing that I do now is work with young people from Church groups and Trinity Western University, training them for street ministry work, and then hitting the streets of the bad areas of town with hot chocolate and goodies, socks etc. We have a bus that is set up for training, so we are mobile and can go anywhere. Our group is called AOK. This stands for acts of kindness. Our song and motto we take from the group "Point of Grace".

When Joshua took over the leadership of the Israelites after Moses died, God promised Joshua “I will never leave you or forsake you.” (Joshua 1:5 NIV). Over a thousand years later God spoke to us through the writer of Hebrews, “Never will I leave you, Never will I forsake you.” (Hebrews 13:5 NIV). The Bible and Its Authority
